Ash Wednesday Worship February 22nd - 7pm

We like many churches use ashes during the **Ash Wednesday** worship in a ritual called the <u>Imposition of Ashes</u>. In this custom, ashes are mixed with a small amount of oil and applied to the forehead of each worshipper. In the Ash Wednesday bulletin these words are written: <u>Earth to Earth</u>, <u>ashes to ashes</u>, <u>dust to dust</u>.

We recall these words as ashes are placed on our heads and we are vividly reminded that: 'we are dust and to dust we shall return'. The ash is a chilling reminder of our mortality, but because our death is now in Christ, our endings are beginnings. The Lenten disciplines of acts of kindness, prayer, and fasting are tools of discipleship that can lead us to renewal as we bury all that is holding us back from truly being alive. Lent is an invitation to a journey that will lead to the new life and resurrection of Easter."

During the season of Lent, we will be holding a special mid-week worship service as part of our Lenten journey together. This year it will again be preceded by a simple soup and bread supper at 6pm then followed by a ½ Hour simple Evening Prayer Service of meditation with a short Lenten message.



Lent Anglo-Saxon: "spring"

As early as the mid-fourth century, Christians have observed a time of preparation before the Easter celebration. The Lenten season begins on Ash Wednesday (February 22) and lasts for 40 days taking us through Holy Week, (April 1st-7th) to Easter Sunday (April 8th). The forty days of Lent recall the 40 day fast of Jesus in the wilderness after his baptism (Matthew 4:2, Luke 4:1-2) and Moses' 40 day fast on Mount Sinai (Exodus 34:28).

Lent is a time of simplicity and preparation.

I invite you to take a 40 day journey, together, with Jesus to Easter!

In Epiphany we walked with Christ while he was among us on the earth, joining with him in establishing his kingdom. Much was revealed to us and we too were called in Epiphany to also reveal God breaking into our world with love, grace and mercy. Now we retreat with Jesus into the wilderness to reflect. God be with us and bless us on our journey together.

STEWARDSHIP MINISTRY 2011-2012

We truly enjoyed our fall financial stewardship program, MAKE IT SIMPLE. We thank you all for participating in this response method and hope that we all grew in our understanding as to what it means to be a faithful financial steward at Bethesda.

It has been a very long time since Bethesda has used commitment cards as an active sign of our faith. This was a positive experience and has made a difference in our tithing.

We had a 50% return of the commitment cards totaling about \$80,000. By the request of the members there were a number of commitment envelopes that were not opened, so we don't know the amount pledged by them. Everyone who was unable to attend our Commitment Ceremony Sunday received a letter in the mail with a commitment card and a stamped return envelope. A few members returned these cards in the mail.

If everyone had responded with a written commitment, our tithe to God and the mission of Bethesda could be \$160,000. Wouldn't that be a great!

A more realistic response based on our commitment cards, is an additional 25 % are probably already committed tithers. That makes our tithe look more like \$107,000.*

We must pray and have faith that God is abundant. We, as the stewardship ministry team, will continue to find ways to encourage members to review their tithe. We need to have faith that God will provide and Bethesda will move forward in its mission.

Please take a look at some possibilities for other sources of revenue. We, invite you to embrace one or two of these suggestions and move forward with them. Please have conversations with yourselves, with us and with God.

*Our tithe for the first 3 quarters of 2011 is about \$80,324.00. If we divide that by 3, we see that we have an estimated additional income of about \$27,000. This gives us an estimated income of about \$107,000.
